

Toy Matching

Place a number in each section of a baking tray. Ask your child to place the correct number of toys into each section.

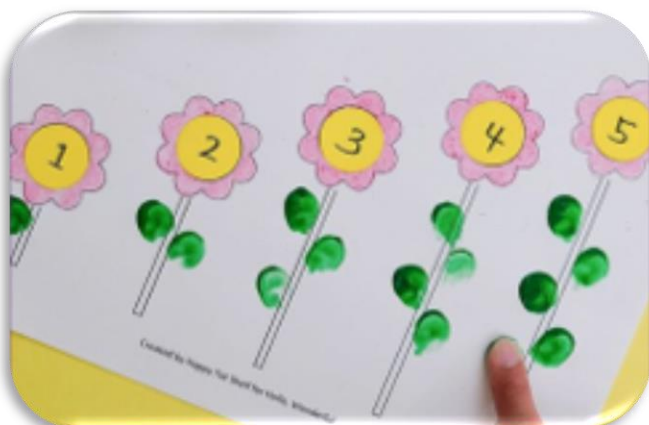


Playing Card Numbers

Use a pack of playing cards and a pot of buttons/Lego etc. Ask children to match the cards with the items.

Playdough, Spaghetti & Cheerios

Gently push un-cooked spaghetti into playdough and place a number next to it. Your child then threads the correct number of Cheerios onto the spaghetti. This also supports fine motor skills, as they must be very gentle. It will also aid in supporting how to deal with emotions such as frustration!

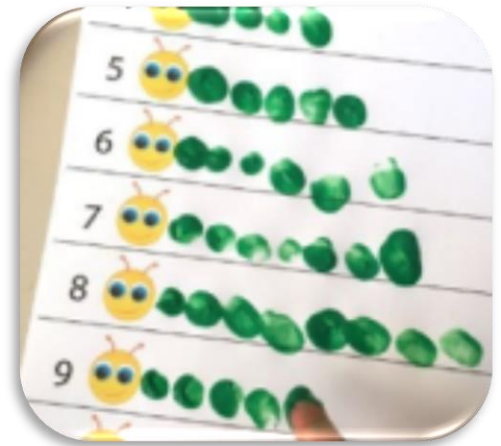


Number Flowers

Draw flowers and write a number on each of them. Ask children to add the right number of leaves using finger painting.

Number Caterpillars

Draw the caterpillar faces next to the numbers and let your child add the correct amount of fingerprints. Use vocabulary such as: You have only done 3 dots - how many more do you need?



Number Pots

Write numbers on pieces of paper and pop in the bottom of containers. Ask your child to use a straw to move the correct number of pom poms into the containers.

Number Plates

Cut a paper plate in half. On one side write a number and on the other, draw dots/stick stickers. Ask your child to join the correct halves together.



Number Stones

Get creative and paint numbers on stones. Then have another set of stones with dots or pictures on. Your child then matches the number stone to the stone with the correct number of dots/pictures on it.
